On behalf of the City of Ingleside, I am reaching out to assure you that the safety and well-being of our citizens and our employees remain our highest priority.

We are closely monitoring the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation, including guidance from the Texas Department of Emergency Management, and are in close communication with the Ingleside School District.

The following updates have been provided to the City:

- Ingleside Little League has postponed the opening ceremonies until April 6, 2020.
- Ingleside ISD has extended Spring Break through March 16-20, 2020 for all students. Please visit www.inglesideisd.org for more information.
- City of Ingleside Latchkey Program will continue to be closed during the extended Spring Break.
- City of Ingleside Parks and Recreation Department is extending the Spring Break Camp that is offered. There are limited spots available. Please contact Parks and Recreation office at 361-776-3438 for more information.
